In partnership with the Cleveland Museum of Natural History, the Kelleys Island Field Station is offering students a chance to participate in a land management study.

Each high school class will be assigned one of the preserves located on Kelleys Island currently managed by the Cleveland Museum of Natural History. As part of the program, students will study biodiversity, track water levels, help eradicate invasive species, learn about public lands management and acquisition, and create a species inventory for public distribution.

While working on the project, classes will be invited to stay at the Kelleys Island Field School. Cost of program varies depending on length of stay and amount of overnight staff supervision required. For planning purposes, we anticipate most classes will spend three days/two nights on the island.
